



## Campaign Fund Endorses Miller and Marlboro Boycott

WASHINGTON, DC - The Human Rights Campaign Fund, the nation's largest Lesbian and Gay political organization, has endorsed the national boycott of Miller Beer and Marlboro cigarettes. The endorsement came at a meeting of the Campaign Fund's Board of Directors in Portland, Oregon in August.

The Board unanimously approved a resolution calling for support of the boycott, urging "members, supporters, Gay and Lesbian Americans and all fair minded people to boycott" the Philip Morris products. In addition, the Board voted to eliminate the products at Campaign Fund events.

"We believe the boycott can play an important role in educating the public about the role Philip Morris has played in undermining the struggle for an effective strategy against AIDS and full civil rights for Lesbian and Gay Americans," said Tim McFeeley, the Campaign Fund's executive director.

"For too long, our community has allowed our funds to flow into the coffers of organizations and corporations who give aid and comfort to our enemies. The Miller and Marlboro boycott sends a clear and compelling message that we will no longer sit by silently, but will work to insure that the rights of Lesbian and Gay Americans are taken into account when corporations determine where to place their financial support," McFeeley noted.

The board-approved resolution states that the Campaign Fund's support of the boycott will continue "until such time as a satisfactory resolution of the issues, as articulated by the principal proponents of the boycott, has been achieved or until otherwise terminated or modified by action of this Board."

The Campaign Fund's action gives added support to the boycott, organized in April by ACT-UP/DC. Beside the Campaign Fund, the boycott has been endorsed by Lesbian and Gay organizations throughout the country, by the United States Student Organization, and the Los Angeles chapter of the 100,000 member United Farm Workers Association.

The San Francisco Sentinel reported in a story by ACT-UP/SF that when ACT-UP/San Francisco initiated the nationwide boycott against the Miller Brewing Company, "we demanded that the Milwaukee brewer address our concerns regarding its relationship with North Carolina Senator Jesse Helms.

"It was never our intention to permanently sever ties with Miller. Instead, we encouraged them to meet with us to discuss the demands of the boycott - that they go on record in the North Carolina media against the Helms legacy of homophobia and AIDS bigotry, and that they denounce their parent company, Philip Morris, for its excessive corporate funding of the Helms Museum and campaigns. It was our hope that out of this discussion a resolution could be reached," the Sentinel continued.

"Miller responded to the boycott by meeting with representatives from ACT-UP on Aug. 28 and parted company with a verbal agreement to take action to end the boycott. But Miller reneged on half of the demands, leaving ACT-UP with no choice but to continue the boycott (in San Francisco)".

And the boycott continues to get results:

\*\* Gay organizations in more than 60 cities have endorsed the boycott to date, posting leaflets and receiving support from their local bars.

\*\* Miller Beer sales are dropping dramatically even in cities where the products are still being sold in the Gay bars. And in cities where Miller has been yanked from the shelves, such as Dallas, Miller Brewing is losing a reported \$100,000 a month, according to the Dallas Tavern Guild.

\* In the 10 weeks since the boycott began, Philip Morris has nearly doubled its AIDS-related donations to \$1 million.

\*\* One New York stockholder has threatened to sell \$1 million in Philip Morris stock if the company does not resolve the boycott.

\*\* In an attempt to stop the damage to Helms' campaign, the Re-Elect Jesse Helms Committee of the Conservative Campaign Fund filed a complaint with the Federal Elections Commission asking for an investigation into the boycott. (OBSERVER, Aug. 22). The American Civil Liberties Union calls the complaint "frivolous".

\*\* And in the midst of a tight senate race in North Carolina, the boycott has put opposition to Helms' bigotry onto the pages of major newspapers nationwide and reminded Gays to donate their dollars to defeat him. [Reprinted, in part, from San Francisco Sentinel]

## 3rd Gay-Related Murder In Tucson Since June

TUCSON - On Thursday, Sept. 14, a Tucson Mountains-area resident was found slain in his home. The victim, Dale Weathers, 64, was found lying in a bedroom of his home. Tucson police said that Weathers died from asphyxiation. The body was discovered by a friend who went to check on him after not being able to contact Weathers by phone, officials said.

An autopsy by the Pima County Medical examiner did not determine how Weathers was asphyxiated because of the "stage of the body's decomposition," said Lt. Steve Morrison of the Tucson Police Department. Exactly how Weathers died and when he died is under investigation. Officials said it appeared Weathers had been dead for more than 24 hours when his body was found.

According to Detective Bill Richards of the TPD Homicide Detail, this was the third apparently Gay-related murder in Tucson since June. According to Richards, Weathers was known to frequent a local park where a chance, casual meeting, would sometimes occur usually with a young man. Friends of the victim concur and had warned Weathers of the dangers involved.

Although Weathers was known as a "very orderly and clean person," his house was discovered in disarray lead-

ing police to believe that Weathers was robbed after his murder.

"Tucson has become a very dangerous community," Richards said. "People should think about their personal safety at all times," Richards added. "We're sympathetic to the problem of the Gay community, and we're here to help."

According to Richards, all three murders, though not believed to be connected are common in that they were all Gay-related - Older men picking up young strangers either hitchhiking, or in parks or bookstores. One of the homicides was the result of the man picking up a hitchhiker, who has subsequently been apprehended. Besides the Weathers' homicide, remaining unsolved is the murder of Kenneth Geiger in a motel on the Benson Highway on June 1. Geiger's truck has been found but police have no clues as to the assailant.

Bill Richards of the Tucson Police Department Homicide Detail, 791-4469; or you may call 88-CRIME which is offering a reward. As a last resort, you may contact the OBSERVER, who will act as intermediary. Your assistance is urgently required.

TWBN is a group of women in Tucson who have gathered for the purpose of bringing awareness to the community regarding the many acts of violence against women and children that occur daily. Such acts of violence include rape, battering, sexual abuse, prostitution, pornography, child abuse and sexual harassment.

There will be a benefit fund raising event at Colette's West on Friday, September 21.

A general organizational meeting will be held on Tuesday, Sept. 27 from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. at the Tucson Women's Commissions building, 240 N. Court.

Peacekeeper training will be held separately. As with any large gathering, rally or march, it is important to maintain the unity and safety of the participants. Peacekeepers are people trained to assist in maintaining this unity and assure a smooth flow to the

march. Peacekeeper training for one event is useful for others, however, even if you have been trained as a peacekeeper, you must go through training for this march to assure consistency and unity.

## Gay Colonel Charges Bias In Court Martial

FORT CARSON, CO - A Fort Carson colonel accused of indecent and homosexual acts asked unsuccessfully to have a court-martial against him delayed to investigate allegations of bias by prosecutors.

Attorneys for Col. Edward Modesto said at a preliminary hearing that Fort Carson's supervising command is looking into allegations of "improper command influence" and requested that the court martial be delayed.

Modesto, a 42-year-old dental surgeon, is accused of engaging in homosexual acts, dressing in a wig and women's clothes and exposing himself at laundromats. He is also charged with possession and use of drugs.

Court records show Modesto performed as a drag queen named Carmen at the Hide 'n' seek Club, a bar frequented by Gays in Colorado Springs, where he dressed in wigs and a red sequin gown.

Capt. Robin R. Kerr took an undercover Army agent to the Hide 'n' Seek Club in March and pointed out Modesto, who reportedly was there with a man known as Veronica.

Kerr told agents that Veronica was a civilian named Ronald Colyer, and that he and Modesto were considered "married". He said they were sexual partners who lived together and had matching rings. The Army claims Modesto is legally divorced.

At the next hearing, the judge, Col. Malcolm Yawn, will decide whether the search was conducted properly and whether to admit the evidence.





It recently won Jeff Palmer the first prize in an Art Competition sponsored by the Center/Long Beach.

There is an infectious strain of hepatitis that can cause several liver diseases and is spread more rapidly than AIDS among Gay men, according to a recent study by the University of Pittsburgh and published in the Journal of the American Medical Association. They say the hepatitis B virus is contracted 8.6 times more easily than the human immunodeficiency virus that causes AIDS. The virus infects an estimated 300,000 more Americans every year. And as many as 5 to 10 percent of them will develop cirrhosis, liver cancer or chronic liver disease the Centers for Disease Control in Atlanta reported.

Studies going back to the early 1980s have shown 50 to 70 percent of Gay men carry the hepatitis B virus according to researchers. Both viruses are linked in similar patterns of spread, both by blood and sexual contact. The B strain is the only one of five types of hepatitis that can be prevented with a vaccine. Anal intercourse puts men at a high risk for contracting hepatitis B. Other studies have claimed higher AIDS infection rates are linked to anal intercourse. SO GUYS, USE CONDOMS AND PRACTICE SAFER SEX!!!

The spermicide Nonoxynol-9 which is claimed to kill the HIV virus is available in most drugstores without a prescription. It comes in foam, a

cream and a jelly and is also on some lubricated condoms. Use foam or cream even on a condom with Nonoxynol-9 in case the condom breaks for better protection... also some of the condoms do not have enough of the spermicide on them, so add some more for better protection.

Want to try a selection of condoms including the MAXI which is 8 1/2 inches long, about 25 percent larger than normal condoms. Send \$6.95 plus \$1.65 for shipping charges to Willamette AIDS Council at 323 W. 13th Avenue, Dept. 10, Eugene, Oregon, 97401. They will also take VISA & M/C or phone orders between 1-5 p.m., Monday-Friday at (503)345-7089. You also get a stylish condom storage canister for your nightstand (or whatever) and a condom rating survey to mail back (anonymously, of course). Just order the PROTECTION SELECTION, it is shipped in a plain brown wrapper.



## A View From The Rock

*A Commentary From Cornerstone Fellowship*

I saw a T-shirt advertised in a magazine today. It said, "IN CASE OF A NUCLEAR WAR, THE BAN ON SCHOOL PRAYER WILL BE LIFTED." I found this to be interesting for a couple of reasons. First, some people seem to think that laws can be (and have been) passed which effectively ban prayer, whether it be in a public school or a nation. Second, it appears that people often see prayer as a last-ditch effort to draw on a Supreme Power that they otherwise ignore during the good times. Both of these views are based on faulty thinking.

The notion that prayer can be controlled by legislation is not a new one. During the Jewish exile hundreds of years before Christ, the prophet Daniel was forbidden to pray to his God, as were the rest of the Jews. Instead, they were commanded to worship an idol set up by the king. Daniel remained faithful to the Lord and prayed to Him daily. When arrested and sent to his death in a lion's pit, Daniel was rescued by God and delivered from his enemies, who were then destroyed for their evil.

There may be a "ban" on school prayer in the fact that teachers are not allowed to lead their students in corporate devotions, but I assure you there are plenty of prayers lifted up daily in our public classrooms, especially at test time! A teacher friend of mine wouldn't make it to sixth period if she didn't pray throughout the day.

In the New Testament, we find a story told by Christ about a wealthy man who ignored God and the poor. When he died, he went to hell, where he was tormented night and day. He looked up to heaven and prayed for a drop of cold water to quench his thirst, but was denied. Then he prayed for a messenger to go back to warn his family about hell, but this request was also denied. The man was too late. He was like many

people, who only offer a prayer of desperation when things are going bad, or death is imminent. Then, when the storm passes over, they go on their merry way, never to seek God again. Until the next crisis, of course.

Unfortunately, most people misunderstand prayer, not only in the secular world, but even in Christian churches. Few believers, lay or clergy, truly understand how prayer works, or the power it invokes. This is not to say that we do not pray, or receive answers to our prayers. It just means we don't always have a handle on what is involved in prayers. Scripture tells us that while we may not know how to pray, or what to pray for, the Holy Spirit intercedes for us and prays to God on our behalf (Romans 8:26-27).

Are you an 11th-hour petitioner? Do you wait until things are rough before you seek out God? Have you been told that you can't pray because you're Gay, or God won't answer your prayer. These things simply are not true. God is in the business of answering prayer. He doesn't care of you're Gay, or steeped in sin or a last minute seeker. He wants to hear from you today. You don't have to need something before you pray to God. Sometimes He just likes to hear how thankful you are for the things He does for you! If you have received any blessing today, whether it be your health, your job, your loved ones, or just a beautiful sunset, let Him know about it. You'll be glad you did.

With that I think I'll wrap this column up for this week and see if I can get it to Bob early. Have a super-bly very special and loving week - I love all of you.



## POLITICS '90

The Primary Election held last Tuesday provided a few surprises. In this column, we will run down the races (Democratic and Republican) and see who are the favorites.

### GOVERNOR

No surprise on the Democratic side. Former Phoenix Mayor Terry Goddard trounced Dave Moss by an 86% to 14% margin. On the Republican side, Phoenix developer, J. Fife Symington III, surprised the political pundits by defeating former governor Evan Mecham by a 2 to 1 margin (46% to 22%), with the other candidates splitting the rest of the vote. The big disappointment was Sam Steiger (the ACP-endorsed candidate) who finished a distant fourth.

Odds-on favorite: Terry Goddard.

### SECRETARY OF STATE

The incumbent vs rabble rouser, could best describe the Democratic contest between incumbent Jim Shumway, versus Richard Mahoney. Political pundits liked Mahoney, but expected Shumway to win. It did not happen. Mahoney defeated Shumway by a 59% to 41% margin. Mahoney will take on State Treasurer, Ray Rottas.

Odds-on favorite: Toss Up.

### ATTORNEY GENERAL

On the Republican side, Mesa attorney Grant Woods came out of the mudslinging fracas with a narrow 5,000

vote victory over Steve Twist. On the Democratic side, Georgia Staton held off a late challenge by Richard Segal and pulled a 12,000 vote victory.

Odds-on Favorite: Grant Woods

### SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION

The Republican Primary saved Diane Bishop, the Democratic incumbent. Dr. Bob Miller, the Mechanite trounced Alice "Dinky" Snell, by a 2 to 1 margin. Despite her problems, Diane Bishop is the favorite.

### TREASURER

The Mechanite, Dick Crawford was narrowly defeated by former State Senator Tony West for the Republican nomination. Mr. West will take on the Democratic nominee, George Stragalas.

Odds-on Favorite: Toss Up.

### LEGISLATIVE DISTRICTS

The legislative races provided the most surprises last Tuesday. Here is a look at the Legislative Races:

#### LD-9

The biggest shocker in the state. A self-described "political upstart", Keith Bee, out-pollled veteran incumbent Bill English, and defeated nine-term incumbent Bart Baker. English and Bee will take on the Democratic nominee, Marion Pickins.

Odds-On Favorite: English and Pickens

#### LD-11

Pro vs Anti-choice. Democratic incumbents, Senator Jaime Gutierrez, Representatives John Kronko and Peter Goudinoff won big defeating the anti-choice conservatives Kathleen Henry (Senate) and Charles Slade (House).

#### LD-12

A big surprise in LD-12 State Senate race (Republican). Moderate Ann Day, lagging in pre-election polls, defeated the Mechanite, Bob Stash by 200 votes. She will take on the Democratic nominee, Katherine Jacobsen.

Odds-on Favorite: Toss Up.

In the LD-12 House race, the Republican incumbents held off the Mechanites. Jack Jewett and Ruth Eskeson defeated Dan Schottel and Les Whalon. They will take on Evan Adelstein and Phil Pierce.

Odds-on Favorite: Jewett and Adelstein

#### LD-14

A DeLong will not be sitting in the State Senate. Mrs. Loretta "San" DeLong was upset in her bid to succeed her retiring husband, Bill DeLong. DiAnn Ewing, a conservative Mechanite, beat "San" by 81 votes out of 13,000 cast. Ewing will take on 4-term House incumbent, Cindy Resnick.

Odds-On Favorite: Cindy Resnick

In the LD-14 House race, Democrats Ruth Solomon, the incumbent, and Herschella Horton will take on Mike Gilbert and Ed Kahn, who emerged one and two in the GOP Primary.

Odds-on Favorite: Solomon and Horton

In the local races for Constable in Justice Precinct 2, Daniel Dorgan upset long-time incumbent Ron DeSchalit by a 53% to 47% margin for the Democratic nomination and the job since there isn't a GOP candidate.



After appealing directly to the company to disassociate itself from the bigotry and misinformation spread by "New Dimensions", GLAAD launched a public awareness campaign. As a result, at least one GLAAD letterwriter has received the following response from the company, "We [Ford] have requested and the dealer has agreed to discontinue using this publication. The dealer was not aware of the editorial in this magazine."

"New Dimensions" is a monthly extremist magazine published by the Foundation of Human Understanding which devotes continuous editorial coverage to stories with a homophobic slant. In the January issue alone (which also contained the Ford ad), six incendiary articles and columns were published on such topics as "Sex and Power: Inside the Secret World of Homosexuality and Trauma Conditioning," "Gays As Child Molesters," and how the "transmission of the AIDS virus has been documented by saliva, household and hand contact."

"We are pleased that Ford has responded to our protest and has taken action to see that the ad is dropped from this dangerous publication," said GLAAD/NY's Executive Director, Craig Davidson. "New Dimensions" is nothing more than a vehicle of homophobic hate-mongering that propagates harmful misinformation about Gay men, Lesbians and AIDS that contributes to anti-Gay violence."

Founded in 1985, GLAAD is the only national organization devoted primarily to discouraging stereotypes and misinformation about Lesbians and Gay men. GLAAD pursues its goal by organizing grass-roots response to public bigotry and working with the media to improve coverage of issues that concern Gay people.

# Survey Measures AIDS Impact On Same-Sex Couples

SEATTLE - A national survey of 1,266 Gay and Lesbian couples found that AIDS has played a role in the decision of many partners to form their current relationship, or their intent to continue it. Fully 52% of men and 23% of women said AIDS played at least some role in their relationship decisions.

The statistics were released by Partners Newsletter for Gay and Lesbian Couples. The publishers who developed

the survey, collected responses in 1988 and 1989.

"Notably couples who gave their relationship the highest quality ratings were those least likely to consider AIDS a factor in forming or continuing their relationship," said Denian, who edits and publishes the bi-monthly newsletter with his 10-year partner Stevie Bryant.



Naturally, AIDS has had far less influence on relationships of at least 10-years duration - those established before 1980, when the risk of AIDS was not generally known. Of those couples, 96 percent said AIDS played no role in the formation of the relationship. In terms of continuing the relationship,

AIDS played no role for 91 percent of women and 66 percent of men together a decade or more.

In more recently formed relationships, AIDS has played an increasingly important role, as shown in the following chart:

Gay couples have often been overlooked in AIDS prevention strategies," said Bryant, "despite the enormous influence of AIDS on couples' lives. Among the male couples surveyed, fourteen percent reported one or both partners with AIDS/ARC or HIV-positive status."

survey form did not define safe sex or other AIDS-related terms).

Overall, far more men than women had adopted safer sex - and men heavily favored safe or possibly safe sex. Of the couples sharing unsafe sex during the last year, 63% were in monogamous relationships and 24% had relationships that were "monogamous with agreed exceptions."

Couples appear to have modified their sexual behavior in response to AIDS. Most couples said they practiced sex that was primarily safe, or were HIV-negative and monogamous. (The

### Concern Grows That Oral-Alpha Interferon Data From Nairobi Is Not Accurate Or May Even Be Fraudulent

NEW YORK, NY - The New York Native newspaper has received some disturbing information which may throw into question some of the more dramatic claims by Kenyan researchers about the effectiveness of oral alpha-interferon.

One American patient named "Joe" was treated with the substance in Nairobi was told that his T-cells had risen dramatically, but when he returned to the United States, they were the same level as when he went to Nairobi.

Another patient, "Richard," who kept a journal for the Native, found out about the discrepancy in "Joe's" T-cell number when he went to Nairobi for a second time to continue his treatment with Oral Alpha-interferon. "Richard", the name under which he wrote his journals, was very upset when he learned about the discrepancy, and subsequently developed streptococcal pneumonia, for which he is being treated in Nairobi. At presstime, the Native said they were told that he is seriously ill.

He told the Native he didn't know who to believe at this point. The Kenyan researchers had told him that his T-cells had risen to 750 from a low of 10-45. He had returned to Kenya with hopes that with further treatment, he would be able to become HIV seronegative. The Kenyan researchers reported that a small percentage of patients treated with oral alpha-interferon no longer test positive for antibodies to HIV, the retrovirus which government

scientists have ruled is the cause of AIDS.

In the United States, hundreds of patients are still taking several forms of oral alpha-interferon.

A patient's buyers club in New York which has been providing patients with Wellferon, a form of alpha-interferon which is produced by Burroughs Wellcome, reports that they have not seen any benefits from the product.

Lenny Kaplan, who runs a buyers club in Ft. Lauderdale, told the Native that over 1200 people are still buying two different forms of oral alpha-interferon from his organization. He told the Native that he is selling both Hysabara interferon, which is the form of interferon that has been used in Kenya, as well as Alferon N Injection, which is produced by a New Jersey firm called Interferon Sciences.

Kaplan further told the Native that he thinks oral interferon is working on the symptoms of AIDS, but that he has not seen the kind of dramatic rise of T-cells that have been reported in Kenya. "It's not a miracle drug, just a weapon," he said. "It does not take T-cells through the roof. There's a slight rise in T-cells and symptoms are relieved." Kaplan also believes that if Wellferon is placed on sugar cubes by the buyers club in New York, it is ineffective because it is easily contaminated with bacteria.

If the claims made by the Kenyan

researchers turn out to be fraudulent in any way, it would hurt what has been portrayed as Dr. David Koehn's distinguished career in science. According to the Weekly Review, a Kenyan publication, Koehn is "one of Kenya's leading immunologists" has "has a total of 137 scientific papers international journals to his credit in the areas of AIDS, bilharzia, malaria and leishmaniasis". After a distinguished scientific career in Kenya, "he proceeded to the world-famous Harvard Medical School in Boston as a Fulbright-Hays scholar for a Ph.D. degree program registered with the University of Nairobi.

If any of the research conducted on oral alpha-interferon turns out to be fraudulent, it will not be the first time that fraud has cast a shadow over "AIDS" research.

The research conducted by Dr. Robert Gallo, who has claimed that he is the discoverer of HIV, and that HIV is the sole cause of AIDS, is currently under investigation for scientific improprieties by a distinguished panel of scientists appointed by the National Institutes of Health.

In addition, research conducted on AZT, the drug that the government has approved for use on people who test positive for antibodies to HIV, has also been questioned by writer John Lauritsen and Peter Duesberg, a retrovirologist at the University of California. In Lauritsen's recent book, "Poison By Prescription: The AZT Story,

he concluded that "tens of thousands of people are now taking AZT, a deadly drug which was approved on the basis of fraudulent research."

Hopefully, the results from clinical trials on oral alpha-interferon being conducted at Mt. Sinai, as well as planned trials in Uganda, Poland, and other countries, will prevent Dr. Koehn, and oral alpha-interferon, from becoming part of the same scientific hall of shame that harbors Robert Gallo and AZT.
