

## Jerome Beillard, Co-Founder of P.A.C.T. Dies At 41

TUCSON - Jerome Beillard, one of Tucson's most respected leaders in the fight against HIV/AIDS whose influence extended to the nation's capital, died this past Wednesday from complications from the disease. He was 41.

Beillard was a co-founder in 1987, of the People With AIDS Coalition of Tucson, (PACT for Life). The goal of PACT was to inspire HIV positive people to empower themselves, to see themselves as advocates in the battle against AIDS. Freeing federal funds for the anti-AIDS drug AZT and fighting discrimination were early priorities for PACT. Beillard served as executive director until September of 1995.

Jerome and other PACT co-founders saw the need for practical support, healthful habits and nutrition that would help people with HIV live positive lives.

In an interview, Susan Mathews, office and property manager for PACT said, "Jerome was so energized and so caring. He always had time for other people, and always was very supportive. I think his philosophy of self empowerment wasn't just something he talked about, he lived it. Jerome wanted to be able to give people the tools to improve their quality of life.

Under Beillard, PACT for Life established Southern Arizona's only federally funded HIV Early Intervention Center, known as the Chuck Mayer Early Intervention Center.

The center, Beillard had said in a previous interview, was his first major accomplishment. It housed an HIV counseling and testing office, a program through which people on low incomes can apply for free AIDS medications and a "wellness program" to teach people about vitamins, massage, stress reduction, quitting smoking and other things they can do to improve their own health. "That was one of the main things, we were telling people to take care of themselves, but we had no place to send them," Beillard had said in a previous interview.

PACT now owns or operates 30 apartments and a small house for people with AIDS who cannot afford their own housing. PACT is about to break down on Stephenson Place, a 25 unit apartment complex with \$1.2 million in grants from the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development. Beillard was almost single handedly responsible for the funding. Robert Gomez, director of the El Rio Health Center said in an interview.

Beillard was involved at the national level on a steering committee overseeing the federal Health Resources Services Administration's Ryan White Care Act, which funded the Early Intervention Center, and as a member of the National Association of People With AIDS.

Beillard also was a driving force behind what have become two of Tucson's most successful annual fund raising events: the Life Thru Art auction held in September, and the Festival for Life, a Christmas tree auction each December which from now on will be named for him.

## 1995 Halloween Invitational Bowling Tournament Set For This Weekend

TUCSON - Approximately 150 bowlers and guests from six states and Canada converge on Tucson this weekend, October 27-29, for the 1995 Halloween Invitational Bowling Tournament (HITT '95).

This marks the sixth year the Tucson Gay and Lesbian bowling community has hosted a bowling tournament.

Bowlers participating in HITT '95 compete in three events: singles, doubles and team. They bowl a total of nine games, and are classified by averages. According to the tournament committee, entering averages range from 101 to 216.

In addition to the bowling, the HITT Tournament Committee has planned a fun fill weekend, which combine other activities to give guests the real flavor of Tucson and to give the locals a chance to meet the out of towners.

Scheduled events range from past favorites, such as the Costume Ball and the Pumpkin Carving Contest to new events such as the Halloween Carnival, Miss HITT, and Late Night Casino at the Desert Diamond Casino, HITT's corporate sponsor, the first in the tournament's history.

The Halloween Carnival takes place, Saturday, October 27, 9 P.M., in the Ballroom at the host hotel, the Ramada Inn (University on Oracle). Local groups, ASOs, and organizations will have booths set up with fun and games, proceeds from which will go to local charities. For the Carnival, the tournament committee is asking for a \$2.00 donation at the door with proceeds going as well to local charities.

The Costume Ball will take place in conjunction with the Carnival, with contestants vying for prizes of \$500. The Pumpkin Carving Contest takes place Saturday afternoon and will be on display and voted on during the Carnival and Costume Ball. Winners will be decided by the highest dollar amount in each pumpkin's collection canister. The contestant will be vying for \$250 in prizes.

Miss HITT 1995, takes place Sunday, October 29, 9 P.M., in the Ballroom at the Ramada Inn. Miss HITT is new this year, with campy fun, but not necessarily a drag show, it's a contest/variety show with local and out of town guests competing for the title of

Miss HITT. The winner gets a crown, sash as is bequeathed the title. All tips and profits from Miss HITT go to local charities.

Throughout the tournament, the Desert Diamond Casino, HITT's corporate sponsor, offers Late Night Casino for HITT bowlers and their guests. The casino will offer special coupons to bowlers to use at the casino. Desert Diamond will be furnishing transportation from the Ramada Inn to and from the Casino for bowlers.

At the reception, the social hour and before the banquet, Michael Spotted-wolf and company, will be performing. In addition to the schedule of events, a dinner will be offered at the Venture-N, Saturday, October 29, 5 to 7 P.M., the cost is \$3.00.

## Echo Magazine Demise Public Access HIV-TV A Hoax Special To Honor Jerome Beillard

PHOENIX - The rumors of Echo Magazine's demise (Observer 587) are greatly unfounded. The Phoenix magazine is the alleged victim of a mail fraud, and continues to publish.

Someone had mailed a letter to the magazine's major advertisers, (and including The Observer.), saying the Echo was going out of business. The letter stated that the company was filing for bankruptcy, and members of the Echo staff were accused of setting the fire that had destroyed their offices. The letter writer photocopied general manager, Jeff Ofstedahl's signature on stationery made up to look like the Echo's, to appear authentic.

Jeff Ofstedahl said, "The Echo is bigger than ever, and are here to stay forever." He added, "Someone went to an awful lot of trouble to do this. It's slanderous and we intend to prosecute to the fullest."

Phoenix police detectives, the fire department and postal inspectors are investigating the mailings in conjunction with the fire, according to Ofstedahl.

## Dole: Aides Erred By Not Accepting Gay Donation

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Republican presidential candidate said that his campaign aides should not have rejected a \$1,000 contribution from the Log Cabin Republicans, a Gay and Lesbian political group.

"I think if they'd have consulted me, we wouldn't have done that," Dole said at a meeting with a group of Washington correspondents.



LETTER TO THE EDITOR:

As a member of TLGA's committee that organized OUToberFEST '95, I would like to thank The Observer for last week's story about the pride picnic. Your page one story was balanced and offered a good representation of the event, as did the photo collage.

And since I was the committee's vendor coordinator, I was also interested in Gary Clark's "As I See It" cartoon. Gary apparently feels that the picnic has become too commercialized. I don't agree. Admission to the event was free, the entertainment was continuous and free,

and there was unlimited free beer and free soda available. Tucson's pride picnic is the only major pride festival in the country that can boast that. How can all that be considered too commercial?

The incredible generosity of the community helps hold down the cost of putting on the event. The tireless efforts of volunteers, and the generous donation of goods/services by organizations and individuals both inside and outside the community saved many thousands of dollars. Nonetheless, there were still several thousand dollars worth of expenses that were required.

Charging vendors a booth space fee to make their goods/services available to the community raised much of that money. Judging by the large number of people who were attracted to the booths, and the positive response from the vendors themselves, it would seem that most folks like having the vendors there. Also, there were 33 non profit organizations represented among the vendors, offering information about their services. Their presence was a real service to the community.

So I pose a few questions: Do we eliminate vendors in the future? Wouldn't that take away a significant part of the event? If the vendors were eliminated, how would we raise the money to put on the picnic? Should we charge admission, as most other pride coordinators throughout the country do (and they still have vendors anyway)? Should we charge for the beverages? Or what? It seems to me that doing either would commercialized the event far more than this year's vendor presence did. --Wasn't it better to have a large event full of entertainment, fun, and a lot to do, that didn't require anyone to dip into their pocket at all?

Planning for OUToberFEST '96 will begin soon, so these and other questions will need to be addressed. TLGA's board has made it clear that they welcome the community's input. Meanwhile, I am cheered and satisfied by the fact that I saw about 5,000 happy faces at OUToberFEST '95.



## Adieu, Jerome

Local AIDS activist Jerome Beillard refused to call people with HIV "victims". In a world that saw only a life to be lost, he celebrated the life still left.

With his death, Tucson lost one of its earliest warriors against much feared, often misunderstood disease. His passing is a great loss.

Beillard, a warmhearted man whose speech was marked by the buttery tones of his native Bordeaux, was not alone in his fight, of course. But he was quick to take a leading role, sharing his hope-filled vision of living well despite sickness.

He became one of the co-founding members of the People With AIDS Coalition of Tucson. A couple of local groups already served that population, but PACT differed in that it was made up of people actually living with the disease. It became one of the first such coalitions in the nation.

Originally a modest, volunteer organization, PACT grew to offer a comprehensive array of services, including testing and counseling, housing assistance, and wellness education that focused on nutrition and stress reduction to improve one's health.

This philosophy of self-empowerment, simple and positive as it is, was radical thinking at the time. In 1987, the year the coalition was formed, testing positive for HIV was considered a quick death sentence.

That year, there were only about 45 reported cases of AIDS in Pima County, with just over 100 deaths statewide attributed to the disease.

Newspapers routinely referred to people with AIDS as "sufferers." Some businesses instinctively discriminated against them. No one talked about living with AIDS, only dying in its shadow.

Today, there is only one original PACT member left alive. Pima County records almost 900 cases of full blown AIDS, and the state has marked about 3,000 deaths, although those now infected live longer than others before them.

But while much remains to be done to educate policy makers on the state and national levels, local fund raising events for local AIDS groups enjoy widespread community and financial support.

The Ryan White Care Act, which Beillard was instrumental in bringing to Southern Arizona, brings in federal dollars to provide services to this special population. And people realize that it is possible to live, work and enjoy life despite HIV.

In short, Tucson has become a more benevolent, compassionate place since the late '80s, in large part because of the dedication of Jerome Beillard.

Ironically, it took a dying man to show the community how to truly celebrate life.

Jerome Beillard is survived by his partner, Robert Markley; his mother, Lysiane Haesler of Tucson; a sister and brother, Christine Larquey and Renaud Beillard of Bordeaux; his niece Celine Larquey of Bordeaux; and five other nieces and nephews, all of Bordeaux.

A memorial "Fete For Jerome" will take place, Friday, November 3, 4 P.M., in the Gold Room of the Quality Hotel, (formerly Ramada Inn Downtown).



## Clinton Backs Gay Job-Rights Measure

WASHINGTON, D.C. (AP) - President Clinton announced his support for legislation that would bar most job discrimination against homosexuals.

"Individuals should not be denied a job on the basis of something that has not relationship to their ability to perform their work," said Clinton in a letter to Sen. Edward Kennedy, D-MA, a sponsor of the measure.

The endorsement is part of a continuing effort by Clinton to end discrimination against homosexuals, presidential adviser George Stephanopoulos said to the National Lesbian and Gay Journalist Association.

Stephanopoulos said the administration had "brought Gay and Lesbian issues out of the closet and into the open."

The proposed Employment Non-Discrimination Act, sponsored by Sens. Kennedy and James Jeffords, R-VT, and Rep. Gerry Studds, D-MA, would prohibit job discrimination, quotas or preferential treatment on the basis of sexual orientation.

Approval of the bill seems unlikely in the Republican controlled Congress, but the president's announcement was received enthusiastically by its supporters there.

Clinton noted that in 41 states, job discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation is legal.

"Men and women in those states may be fired from their jobs solely because of their sexual orientation, even when it has no bearing on their job performance," Clinton said in his letter.

"Those who face this kind of job discrimination have no legal recourse, in either state or federal courts," he said. "This is wrong."

The bill would exempt small businesses, the military, religious organizations and educational institutions that are substantially controlled or supported by religious organizations.

"The provision, which I believe is essential, respects the deeply held religious beliefs of many Americans," said Clinton.

The measure also would not require employers to provide equal benefits to the same sex partners of employees. Stephanopoulos said Clinton does not support federal sanctioning of same sex marriage.

Twenty nine senators are co sponsoring the Senate bill and more than 100 House members are backing the House version.

## Tucson United Against Violence Update

(PART ONE OF TWO)

Since the printing and distribution of Lesbian and Gay Domestic Violence: A Resource, TUADV has been significantly active.

Beginning in June 1995, Lavina Tomer, TUADV Chair, was appointed to the mayor's Task Force on Domestic Violence. This Task Force has met monthly for discussion and clarification of goals, values, weaknesses and strengths in our current system response to domestic violence, and areas of priority to focus on for a proposal of a coordinated system response to domestic violence in Tucson and Pima County. The timeline to implement this coordinated approach is 5 years.

Lavina was appointed to this Task Force to be a voice about concerns of Lesbians and Gay men in regards to domestic violence. Here is a short report specific to the Lesbian and Gay Community.


Number 6 in the stated values of this Task Force reads as follows: Service (meaning all services for victims, perpetrators, and children from violent homes) should be accessible to those who are elderly, sexual minorities, communication or mobility impaired, youth, or developmentally disabled. Programming should address the dual needs of those who are mentally ill or substance abusing.

On September 14, 1995 two Focus Groups met to answer several specific questions assigned by the Mayor's Task Force. The members of the focus groups were invited to attend and chosen on the basis of their visible involvement and interest in domestic violence in our community. Fifteen Gay men and Lesbi-

ans met in all, representing social services, mental health, law enforcement, survivors of domestic violence, a church and the medical community.

For a clue to your hidden deep self, consider your projections. The thing you hate in other men, feelings of insecurity and weakness, are within you. You probably hate these things in yourself first, then project them out onto other men, or choose men who have these qualities so you can hate your own neediness "out there." You need to love and forgive the part of you that feels weak and insecure first. Take a few minutes when you first get up in the morning and also at night right before you go to bed. Give yourself comfort. Talk to yourself like this: "I know you're feeling insecure. It's OK, I'll always love you." Let the strong part of you hold the weak part of you. Hug yourself, caress your-

self, masturbate yourself lovingly (not necessarily to orgasm). You deserve it! After a week of doing this, go back out and follow your instincts. Be open to how you may have changed!

Dear Hopeless: Congratulations for being so honest with yourself, and for caring so deeply about your lover! It's not easy. Your lover hasn't actually betrayed you, since he didn't promise you monogamy in the first place. Did you have guidelines such as, "Never in our bed," or "Outside sex is OK as long as you don't tell me about it," or "as long as you do tell me about it"? It's good to talk about such things openly as early in the relationship as possible. There are so many ways for gay men to structure their relationships, from total monogamy to total "freedom." None is inherently right or wrong, but the agreements should be negotiated in a way that each man feels respected. Reading your letter, your fear of being "left out" pops out at me. This may be the deep issue operating here. When your lover has sex with others, he may not be trying to exclude you at all. If you look at your childhood, you'll probably find that you had pain about being left out by other members of your family. You may be carrying over this pain into your adult relationship, even though it may not apply. On a yet deeper level, you may subconsciously give your lover the feeling of being left out, since we always tend to make other people feel the way we felt as children. Why don't you ask your lover if there are any ways he feels left out by you? If so, you can take steps to heal both of your feelings. Monogamy can be

a wonderful thing if it is mutually, consciously chosen as an expression of love, but it can be a terrible, binding, boring thing if it is insisted upon out of a fear of being abandoned. Have an honest talk with your lover and find an arrangement that meets both of your needs. You may be surprised at the common ground you can find.

[Oh Bob, actions speaker louder than words! Frankly, your past actions show that you just don't support us. Frankly, we don't believe, trust, support or for that matter, vote for you!]

Ward 6 Council member, Molly McKasson nominated Alex Kimmelman, with Ward 1 Council member Bruce Wheeler seconded. Kimmelman was voted down by a three to two vote.

Mayor George "Four more years?" Miller then asked if any of the Council members would change their votes. [Fat chance!] McKasson and Wheeler then ticked off their top five choices. 



## A View From The Rock

A Commentary From Cornerstone Fellowship

A few years ago a friend of mind from Switzerland came to visit the United States for the first time. We spent a lot of time in the malls window shopping. When the clerks saw us, they'd approach, smile, and say, "Hello, how are you?" I would reply "Fine, how are you?" This really perplexed my friend. "They don't even know me. Why are they asking how I am?" Of course, the clerks walked off to greet other shoppers before my friend could formulate an answer in English. I explained to her that we Americans say that to one another and usually don't expect an answer. It is just a meaningless phrase. Think about the number of times you use one of those phrases, and the number of times you reply to one of them without thinking.

A word which has become almost meaningless from overuse is the word, "hope". According to the dictionary it means "an expectation that something desired or promised will occur." Hope is what we cling to when all else fails. We say, "I hope to see you again. I hope I don't get a speeding ticket. I hope I win the lottery. I hope you have a nice day. I hope you will come back." These are just some of the ways in which we use this word, and "hopefully" when we say it we when we mean it some of the time!

Have you ever heard someone say, "I hope I'm going to heaven?" Many of us want to think that we'll go anywhere but to heaven when we die. We hope we'll go to a better place; a place where there is no pain, no sickness, no prejudice, no tears, no sorrow. But no one just has to hope they are going to heaven. I can say, as can many other Christians, that I know that I am going to heaven! That's not presumptuous or wishful thinking. It is a promise from God!

What is this promise? The Bible says, "Whoever believes in the son (Jesus) has eternal life (in heaven), but whoever rejects the son (Jesus) will not see life, for God's wrath remains on him." (John 3:36) It doesn't say, "If you believe a certain doctrine". It doesn't say "if you are straight". It doesn't say, "If you go to a certain church." You might be saying, "That's not what I heard!" it's not what I was told for many years, either. But one day, I found out the truth and I was really surprised. And now you have heard it too. Are you as surprised as I was? Religions have changed the requirements to get into heaven, God didn't change them!

It's simple: Just accept Jesus Christ's death on the cross as payment for your sins and receive him as your savior. When you die, it won't be Buddha meeting you in heaven, or Krishna, or Mohammed. It will be Jesus Christ. He is the only one who died for our sins so that we could be forgiven. Because I have accepted Jesus as my savior, I can say that I know, not hope, that I am going to heaven!
